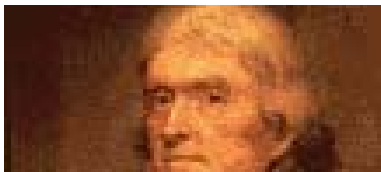


Looking Into Holidays Past
